- ▶ **Planning and Preparation:**
 - ▶ Scheduling: Prakash & Binish created a schedule for the training sessions, specifying the dates as 24th August 2024.

▶ **ACTIVITY 1. INDIAN SIGN LANGUAGE**

▶ **ACTIVITY 1. INDIAN SIGN LANGUAGE**

- ▶ Mr. Prakash Pandey commenced the training session at 11am by introducing the children. Before initiating the training activities, he inquired whether the children were prepared and eager to learn new things. Once their interest was established, she proceeded with the ISL (Indian Sign Language) sessions.
